Many types of antifreeze and ice melt are toxic to pets; be alert on walks and check both dogs' and cats' foot pads regularly for cuts or irritation.



Colder weather means older dogs may experience more osteoarthritis-related pain. Your veterinarian is the best source of care for your senior pet.
